- 1. The meeting was called to order by Kristen O'Hagan at 7:11 p.m.
- 2. Mr. McNally introduced East Rockaway High School senior Elliot Reyes who led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Ms. O'Hagan welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced Superintendent of Schools Mrs. Lisa Ruiz who began the evening's presentations.

Ms. Ruiz welcomed everyone to tonight's meeting and thanked everyone for coming out. It is our annual tradition that we celebrate the Board of Education as part of the NYSSBA's School Board Recognition Week which is October 18-22, 2021. Ms. Ruiz, on behalf of the East Rockaway community expressed her thanks for the continuous hard work of the Board. She also thanked their spouses and families for supporting the work of our trustees.

Ms. Ruiz then introduced Mrs. Calia Kelly, principal of Centre Avenue School who will be hosting this evening's board recognition. Mrs. Kelly spoke on behalf of the Board of Education and thanked them for all they do for the students.

A video tribute was shown wherein students in different grades expressed thanks to the board of education. Two Centre Avenue students also thanked the Board of Education with prerecorded video messages. Certificates and items of appreciation were presented to the Board and a photo was taken. Ms. Ruiz thanked Mrs. Kelly, the Centre Avenue PTA, students, and staff for tonight's presentation.

Mrs. Ruiz then introduced Mr. Vincent Healy, PPS Director, who spoke about special education teacher Brianna Ostrander. Mr. Healy spoke about her accomplishments and successes in the district. A video tribute was shown. Mr. Healy was honored to recommend Ms. Ostrander for tenure to the Superintendent and Board of Education.

Thereafter, Mrs. Ruiz introduced Mrs. Calia Kelly, principal of Centre Avenue School, who spoke about elementary teacher Heather Figliozzi. Mrs. Kelly spoke about her accomplishments and successes in the district. A video tribute was shown. Mrs. Kelly was honored to recommend Ms. Figliozzi for tenure to the Superintendent and Board of Education.

Mrs. Ruiz then introduced Dr. Ayesha McArthur, Rhame Avenue School principal, who spoke on behalf of retiree Diane Dorato, library teacher aide at Rhame Avenue School. Mrs. Dorato was called to the stage and presented with a recognition gift. Ms. Ruiz wished her much happiness in the future and thanked her for her many years of service in the district.

Mr. Richard Schaffer, principal of the East Rockaway Jr./Sr. High School, spoke about and congratulated Junior-Senior High School senior Madeleine Prucha who was named a Commended Student in the 2022 National Merit Scholarship Program. Madeleine was recognized for demonstrating exceptional academic promise.

Mr. Schaffer also spoke about and congratulated Junior-Senior High School student Sofia Valdebenito on being selected for the College Board National Hispanic Recognition Program. Sofia was recognized for both her academic achievements and outstanding performance on the PSAT/NMSQT.

The next presentation was the Bond Status Update and Proposed Expansion. Mrs. Ruiz stated that these presentations were relative to the progress of our bond and the upcoming special vote to expand the bond work.

Mrs. Ruiz introduced Francesco Borgese and Gary Gonzalez from Park East Construction who provided a bond status update about the progress of our bond work. Following that presentation, Mrs. Scrio, Assistant Superintendent for Finance and Operations introduced district architect John Grillo, who explained the contingency projects already approved in the bond. He also discussed the new proposed ventilation expansion projects that will be presented to the community for a vote on November 15, 2021. Mrs. Scrio then introduced Mr. William Jackson, of Hawkins Delafield and Wood, the district's bond counsel. Mr. Jackson explained the proposition on the ballot for the bond vote. If approved by the community, this proposition will authorize the district to expand the bond work to include the two new projects with no additional expenditures or additional impact to the taxpayer. 11. Reports

A. Superintendent's Report

Achievement

Students in World Language in eight grade are working on speaking in the target language by presenting about themselves, their lives, and our school.

For the past several weeks, students have been immersed in a series of lessons around the One Book, One School text, *I Am Malala*. Staff participated in a trivia challenge; students analyzed statistics in math class about women in education; students evaluated culture components of the text in World Language, and watched a short interview in science. Students in Grades 7 - 9 watched the film version on PSAT day and participated in debrief activities after.

School Counselors presented to 10th and 11th grade classrooms to discuss the structure of PSATs, and tips for success. English and math teachers conducted content specific lessons to help prepare their students for the test. Our 10th and 11th Graders then took the PSAT on October 13, 2021. On this day, 164 students were tested.

In Algebra, 8th grade students engaged in a formative assessment project where they translated between words, symbols, tables, and area representations of algebraic expressions.

Driver's Education is beginning the Fall portion of the program. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, students that were not able to complete the driving portion of the program, will be able to register for this portion of the class.

Opportunity

UHS Farmingdale course registration for the Fall took place and East Rockaway High School has 66 students enrolled for college credit in at least one dual enrollment course. Courses include Pre-Calculus, Statistics, Accounting, and Special Topics in Engineering. This represents an over 95% registration rate. Our Introduction to Legal Studies course through Farmingdale begins in the Spring in addition to the over 80 students enrolled in a course through Syracuse University Project Advance and other courses through our partnerships with St. John's University and SUNY Albany.

All 12th Grade students have participated in college essay workshops. All students were also able to meet with their counselors and English teachers to review their college essays before

they apply to colleges this fall.

The high school art department is planning its second annual virtual portfolio night, to take place November 4th, 2021. AP Art Students will be able to discuss their portfolios with representatives from various art colleges and programs.

Our Science Chairperson and resident science researcher, Mrs. Forbes, pushed into the science research classes to share her experience in the field and to get students excited about opportunities to conduct research on Long Island.

Athletics has provided additional opportunities for the winter season by offering a boys and girls winter track.

Innovation

In Ms. Olsen's multimedia class, students used Photopea to create collages that showed off their interests.

Connection

Students in advisory participated in a homecoming poster making contest to show their school spirit and build camaraderie.

Students in Mr. Crowley's AP Environmental class were able to attend a zoom meeting with professors from the University of Miami about the Atlantic Hurricane Season. This was a great opportunity for our young scholars to interact with professionals and graduate students in the field and to hear doctoral students discuss: What has happened this hurricane season so far, what to expect for the remaining months this season, and what active research is being done (in and out of the field).

This year's homecoming weekend was a great success! From our parade through the village, to Pep Rally at Memorial Park, it was truly a community event! Our homecoming game at Malverne was successful, as our football team defeated Island Trees, and our class and other clubs had extremely successful fundraisers! Our high school band and chorus students performed the National Anthem, School Fight Song and other selections during the Pep Rally and Homecoming game.

School counselors made two presentations to parents over the past few weeks. On September 29, 2021, our annual Financial Aid and Post-Secondary Planning Workshop was held for families of the Class of 2022. Additionally, on October 6, 2021, as part of the PTA meeting, parents of 8th and 9th grade students were invited to hear about the transition to high school level courses and how to begin thinking about post-secondary readiness.
